### Award-winning Russian Artist and Internationally Renowned Cuban Artist to Unveil New Exhibits at a Meet & Greet in Miami

**WHAT:** Russian-born Xenia Prokhorova will unveil nine pieces of her new collection, *The Supreme Creation*, which exemplifies her artistic presentation of esthetic interests. She utilizes a myriad of mediums in her creative work, but portrait, as a genre, has special meaning for her. Her paintings of human characters are distinctly unique. The dialectic nature of existence, individuality, the quest for intimacy, and the revelation of the human character are essential themes in her art.

Fredy Villamil was born in Cuba and is one of the most significant, internationally renowned representatives of Cuban plastic arts. He studied fine arts at the EVA (Cuba's Vocational School of Art) and La Quinta de Los Molinos (The Mill's Quarters), both in Havana, Cuba. After graduating in 2010, Villamil immigrated to the United States. The 20 ceramic pieces to be displayed in his exhibit *Ceramics* are reportedly autobiographical and represent where he has been, personal experiences, and feelings that have affected him.
